OVERVIEW

The multi-donor Livelihoods and Food Security Fund (LIFT) managed by UNOPS has been present in Myanmar since 2009, supporting Myanmar's people to reach their full economic potential and increase their resilience through improved nutrition, income diversification and skills development.

LIFT's 2019-2023 strategic thematic programmes of Nutrition, Financial Inclusion, Agriculture, Markets and Food Systems and Decent Work and Labour Mobility intensify LIFT's focus on inclusion of the most vulnerable through four strategic shifts:

- Increase focus on inclusion and social cohesion
- Intensify efforts on gender equality and women's empowerment
- Increase geographical focus on ethnic/border states and conflict-affected areas
- Bring internally displaced people and returnees into LIFT's development programmes

KEY STATS

LIFT has allocated USD 579 million for 227 projects across 295 out of a total 330 townships in Myanmar. The support reached 12.8 million of the most vulnerable people.

COVID-19 hit Myanmar in March 2020 and demanded flexibility and action. Under its 2019-2023 Strategy, in response to the outbreak of COVID-19, LIFT quickly adapted and responded to the pandemic to support the early recovery of vulnerable populations.

Through a commitment of USD 28.9 million, LIFT's COVID-19 response supported 2.9 million of the most vulnerable and food insecure women and men, boys and girls in 2,000 villages in 72 townships in 12 states and regions of Myanmar - without a break in operations.
