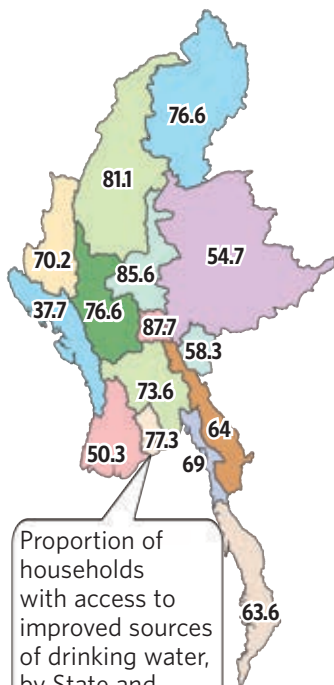




Drinking water

76.6% of all household's main source of drinking water is classified as an improved water source. At the Union level it is lower at 69.5%.

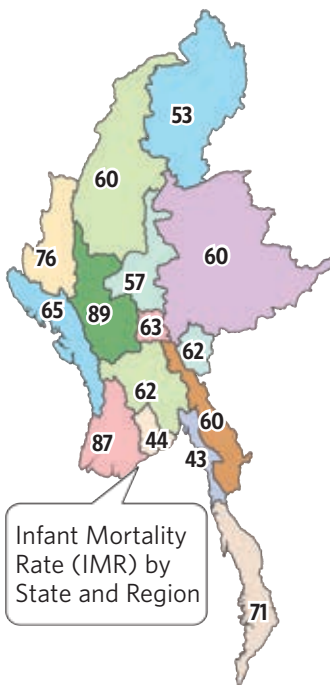


Proportion of households with access to improved sources of drinking water, by State and Region



Childhood mortality

In Magway Region, 89 out of 1,000 infants die before their first birthday (Infant Mortality Rate IMR), the highest in the country, and much higher than the Union level IMR of 62.

Sanitation

68.4% of all households have toilets that are classified as improved sanitation facilities, at the Union level the figure is 74.3%.



The Under-5 Mortality Rate for Magway Region is also the highest in the country, 108 out of every 1,000 children die before reaching their fifth birthday. At the Union level the figure is 72.

Life expectancy



A person in Magway Region lives on average until the age of 60.6 years, lower than the Union life expectancy of 66.8 years.



Housing amenities

22.7% of households use electricity as their main source of energy for lighting; there are wide disparities between State/Region and urban and rural areas. At the Union level it is 32.4%.



84.9% of households use firewood as their main source of energy for cooking. At the Union level it is 69.2%.

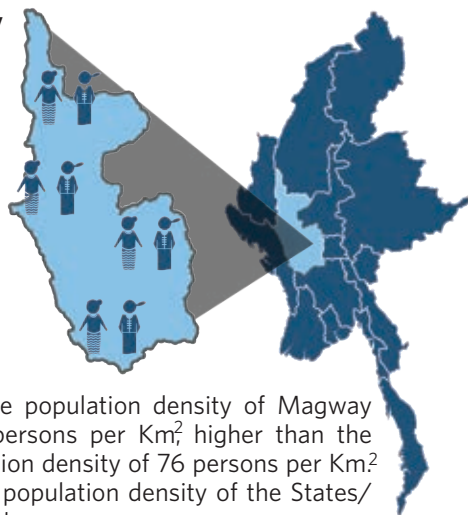

Population density



In March 2014, the population density of Magway Region was 87.4 persons per Km² higher than the Union level population density of 76 persons per Km². It ranks seventh in population density of the States/Regions in the country.

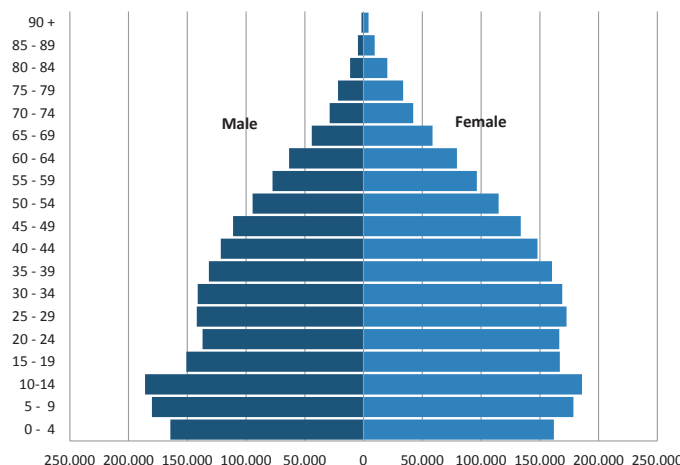

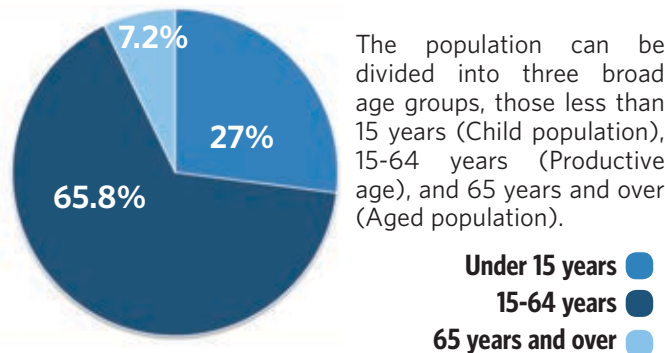
46.3% of the population are male and 53.7% are female.

Population Pyramid of Magway Region, 2014



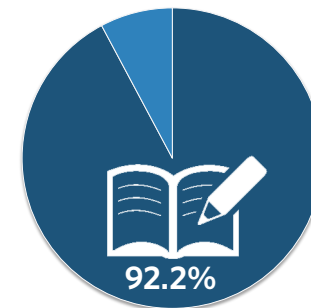
The population pyramid for Magway Region in 2014 is pot-shaped; an almost similar shape to the population pyramid of the Union. This shape implies a declining proportion of children in the population and a bulge in the population aged 5-14 years.

Dependency Ratio

In Magway Region the Total Dependency Ratio was 51.9 in 2014. The dependency ratio measures the pressure on the productive population. The Total Dependency Ratio is lower than at the Union Level which was 52.5 in 2014.



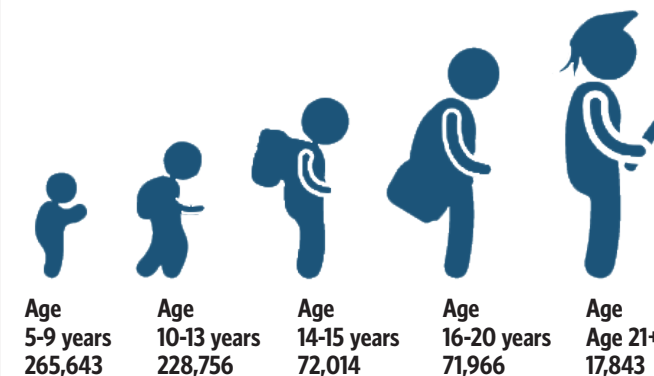
Literacy

Out of 2,753,529 people aged fifteen years and over, 2,540,124 reported that they were able to read and write. The literacy rate for Magway Region is 92.2%, higher than the Union literacy rate of 89.5%. Literacy rates are higher for males (96.5%) than females (88.9%).



School attendance

Out of a population of 3,463,963 persons aged 5 years and over living in conventional households, 656,222 are currently attending school.



Labour force participation rate

71.3% of all people who are of working age (15-64) were in the labour force. The proportion of males in the labour force is higher (86.8%) than females (58.5%).



Housing conditions

92.5% of households in Magway Region own their house.
