SUPPLEMENTARY NOTIFICATION
FOR FACTORIES, WORKPLACES AND ESTABLISHMENTS
COMPLIANCE IN RESPECT OF COVID-19
MAY 3, 2020

Article 1

The Ministry of Labour, Immigration and Population (MOLIP) announced the statement on 19th April 2020 that ,with the objective of control of and protection against the COVID-19 pandemic, factories and workplaces throughout the Union of Myanmar will be allowed to open only after inspection during the period (20th April 2020 – 30th April 2020) and complying with the advices and stipulations of the Ministry of Health and Sports (MOHS), Ministry of Labour, Immigration and Population (MOLIP), and combined expert teams.

Article 2

During the control of the Global Pandemic, the followings factories, workplaces and establishments are set as (A) Essential Business, (B) Public Services and (C) Required Business for the General Public

(A) Essential Business

- State-owned factories, workshops and business
- Water supply business
- Distribution of Electricity and Fuel Energy business
- Fire service business
- Private hospitals, Clinics and health services
- Communication, Information and Technology business

(B) Public Services

- Transportation, Storage and warehouse business
- Port, freighting and logistics business
- Import and Export works
- Municipal Services
- Banking and financial services
- Insurance and non-manufacturing services
- Employment opportunities
- Information product business
- Fleet or Toll management companies
- Hotels, Motels and Guesthouses

(C) Required Business for the General Public

- Printing and publishing business
- Natural resource and mining business

- Chemical industry
- Construction works
- Cold storage and seafood business

Article 3

The businesses and services mentioned in article 2 shall re-open to run business. Therefore, the companies need to prepare the compliance according to the COVID19 stipulations and workplace guidelines provided by the Ministry of Health and Sports (MOHS). After preparation, the companies should inform with proven records to MOHS and MOLIP and combined expert teams for inspection.
